Understand your options.

Financial aid is available to help you and your student pay for college. **Our Student Financial Services counselors are ready to help you every step of the way!**

Types of aid available:

- Freshman scholarships
- Transfer scholarships
- Work-study opportunities
- Local and state grants and scholarships
- Student loans

First-year scholarships your student could be awarded:

- Trustee Scholarship: \$25,000
- Presidential Scholarship: \$20,000
- Provost's Scholarship: \$17,500
- Dean's Achievement Scholarship: \$15,000

Submit your FAFSA.

To be considered for grants and federal student loans, **your student must submit their FAFSA each year.** Grants are available to help reduce the costs of your student's undergraduate education, and student loans provide essential funds to fill financial gaps.

Grants and loans to help pay for college

Types of grants available:

- University of Bridgeport Grant
- Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (SEOG)
- Pell Grant
- Teacher Education Assistance for College and Higher Education (TEACH)

Types of loans available:

- Stafford Loans*
- Direct Parent PLUS Loans

*Your student must be enrolled in a minimum of 6 or more credits to qualify for federal student loans.
