Gain career-ready experience with clinical coursework

Thanks to a grant from the Health and Human Services Administration (HRSA), you may be eligible for up to \$10,000 toward your tuition through a field placement stipend. HRSA grant recipients are placed at agencies serving populations across all age groups — helping satisfy your fieldwork requirements while equipping you with essential knowledge and skills for working in urban and medically underserved areas.

Admission requirements

Program prerequisites

- Bachelor's degree from an accredited university or recognized international institution
- Cumulative undergraduate GPA of 3.0 or higher (will consider lower GPAs for highly qualified applicants)
- 9 credits in undergraduate psychology coursework with a grade of B or higher
 - 3 of the 9 credits may be in an area closely related to psychology
 - Applicants are recommended to have three undergraduate credits in either abnormal psychology or psychopathology
- Minimum of 6-9 months of field experience working in social service agencies, mental health professions, or substance use intervention sites

Required materials

- Complete the application for enrollment at bridgeport.edu/apply
- Official transcript for the last degree earned**
- Resumé
 - For Clinical Mental Health Counseling applicants, significant experience in the field of counseling must be demonstrated
- Two letters of recommendation
 - Letters may come from employers, professors, or professional associates
- Personal statement
 - In 200-500 words, detail your interest in the counseling program, your relevant academic and personal experience, and how this degree will impact your career goals
- Interview
